## Chicago Mixed-Media Artist Matthew Lew Donates Painting For Poe Center Charity Auction

**RALEIGH, N.C. (October 16, 2012) -** World-renowned artist, Matthew Lew, will attend the Poe Health Young Professionals Fundraiser for the Alice Aycock Poe Center for Health Education on Saturday, February 23, 2013, to raise awareness of health education and disease prevention in North Carolina. Lew has donated a painting from his fine art collection for the event's silent auction, to help raise money for Poe's statewide programs.

It is easy to fall fast for Matthew Lew. Even with an impressive worldwide client roster that includes President Barack Obama (Obama gifted a Matthew Lew painting to South Korean President Lee Myung-bak), Lew remains a down-to-earth artist and philanthropist whose reach extends far beyond his Chicago gallery.

Last year, Lew made his way out to Baltimore to donate his time and talent to an episode of ABC's *Extreme Makeover Home Edition* where he created a mural to help girls shine, create, serve and lead to benefit the Girl's Hope organization. Why stop there?

Lew has donated over \$100,000 in original artwork and has painted live at LGBT events to support the Positive Aware Network, the Telluride AIDS Benefit, GLAAD and the Human Rights Campaign in Chicago, NYC, Boston and Denver.

When asked to participate in the Poe Health Young Professionals Fundraiser for the Alice Aycock Poe Center for Health Education, Lew replied, "Done. When do you need the artwork?"

A giving heart coupled with an enormous amount of talent make Lew an ideal partner for the Poe Center. Statewide health education programs will be delivered to over one million children this upcoming year.

"It's important to educate and help individuals and communities improve their health, by increasing their knowledge or influencing their attitudes toward living a healthy and vibrant life," Lew noted.
